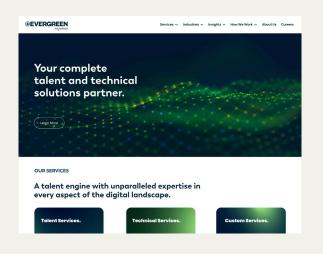

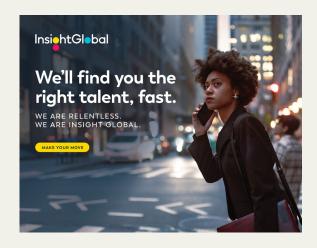

## Case Study #1: Logo Design

# Point to the Future

## Challenge

Point University's newest scholarship, Point to the Future, required a logo that achieved two key goals: embodies the university brand and has the ability to stand on its own. The logo should reflect a professional, philanthropic, and hope-filled initiative that provides a free-tuition option for college as a benefit to working adults.

### Solution

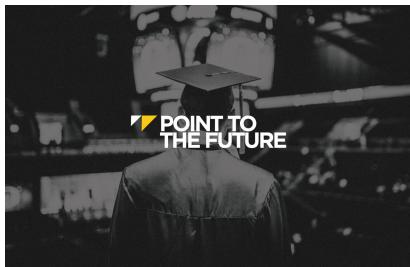
I developed a variety of logo lock-ups that successfully bridged the gap and empowered the scholarship to stand on its own when necessary.

## **Design Details**

By incorporating the same font and colors, I successfully connected the scholarship logo to Point University's brand, creating a consistent visual language. The logo's design remains strong and memorable when presented separately from the university's branding.

## Challenge

Each holiday season, Insight Global launches their Jobs & Joy initiative, donating \$2,000 for every 100th new hire. Through this initiative, IG will hire 10,000 new people, giving them the opportunity to pay it forward and support one of our eight amazing charity partners. Insight Global needed an exclusive identity to accompany this initiative to both gain recognition year after year, and evoke excitement and motivation across the entire sales division.

### Solution

The result is a campaign identity that is simple enough to fit within Insight Global's brand, yet strong enough to be recognized year after year.

## **Design Details**

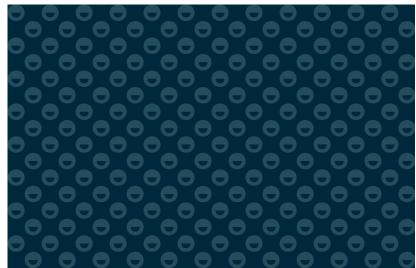

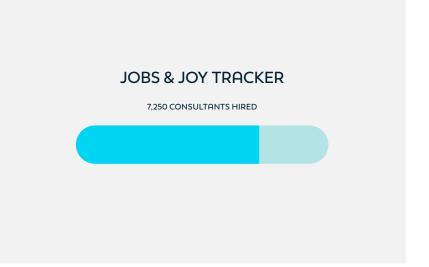












## Case Study #3: Personal Brand

### Solution

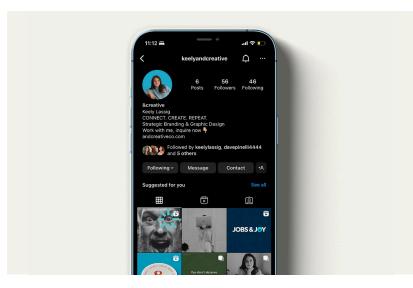

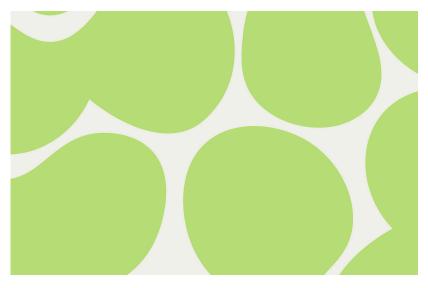
## **Design Details**

## Challenge

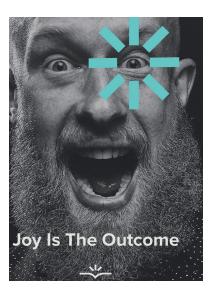
Harvest Ministries is a new financial literacy division of a megachurch located in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Through educational sessions and professional courses, Harvest Ministries aims to equip church members with the knowledge and tools needed to make informed financial decisions. The logo design will seamlessly integrate with the existing church branding, ensuring immediate recognition by members. Additionally, the logo will incorporate clear visual elements that represent financial concepts, solidifying the program's focus on financial education.

### Solution

Through a collaborative design process, several logo options were created that achieved both objectives. Each logo's color palette and overall aesthetic mirrors the established visual language of the church. This ensures immediate recognition by church members and fosters a sense of familiarity with the new program. Subtle nods to finance are used in the iconography of the logo lock-ups. The logo designs remain clean and uncluttered, prioritizing a clear and concise message. This ensures legibility across various applications, from print materials to digital platforms.



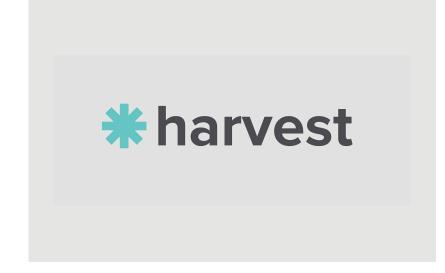


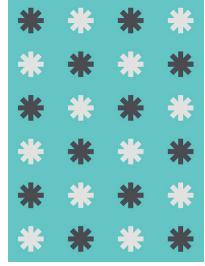














## Case Study #5: Conference Identity

## Without Limits

## Challenge

Build a conference identity that tells a story of limitless opportunities and will be featured throughout downtown Austin, TX. A notable challenge this project presented was the requirement to maintain a cohesive identity while working with external design, print, and event vendors.

### Solution

I collaborated with a team of 5 designers to develop a conference identity guide that detailed the specific expectations in the event a vendor would need to develop their own deliverables. Deliverables our team produced include stage design, print design, event design, swag design, mobile application design (UX/UI), and registration web-page design consultations.

## Evergreen

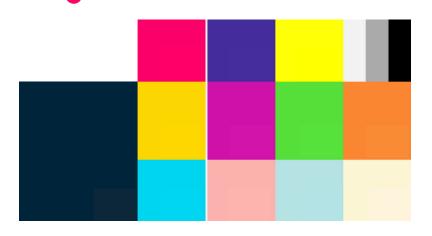
## Challenge

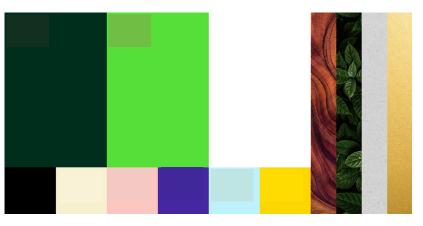

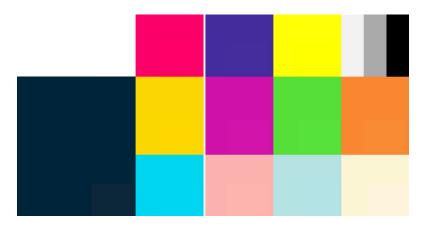
## **Design Details**

A logo refresh, minimized color palette, cohesive graphics and typography, and on-the-nose imagery are the primary adjustments that make this rebrand as successful as it has been.

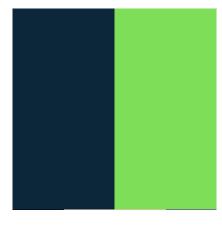

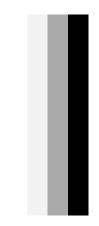

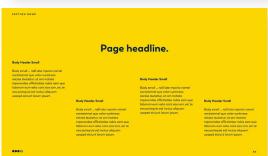
## Challenge

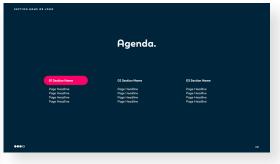

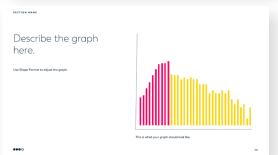
### Solution

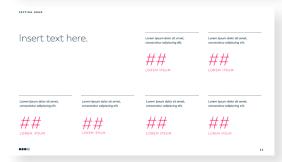

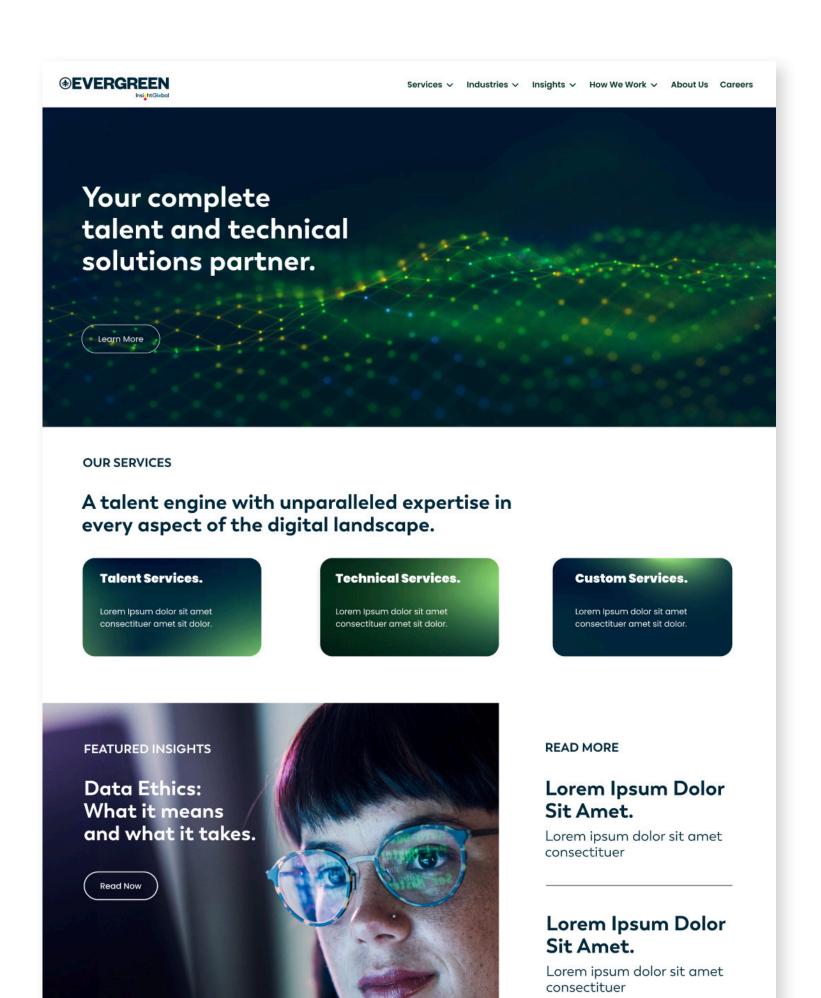
## Evergreen Web Proposals

## Challenge

A big question mark as we worked through Insight Global's Evergreen rebrand was the website. As we were working with the executive team on the core pieces of the brand, collateral mockups were a handy tool to communicate our ideas. This was one of the most successful mockups I generated throughout that process.

### Solution

I chose a hero image that played into Evergreen's technical services and Insight Global's core graphic (the circle). Evergreen is intended to be the more modern and innovative leg of Insight Global, so gradients and imagery with modern qualities were selected for this mockup. I chose to feature blog posts and articles towards the top of the page to quickly establish credibility. Looking back, the first piece of feedback I would give to myself is to make the CTA buttons a little more enticing.

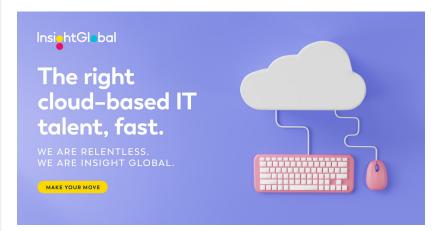
## The Right Talent

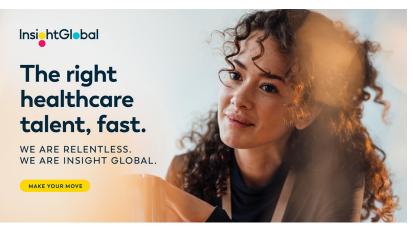


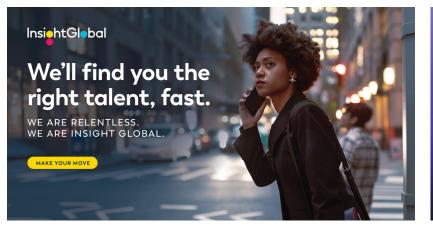














## Case Study #11: NBC Peacock Pause Screen

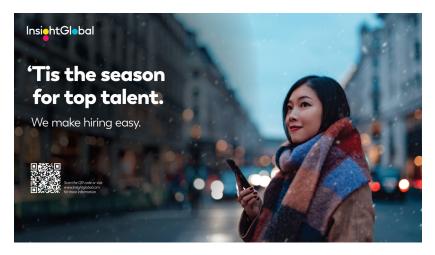
## Seasonal Ads

I designed and wrote the copy for fall and winter inspired ads. I chose cinematic-style photography since the audience is already in "cinema mode."











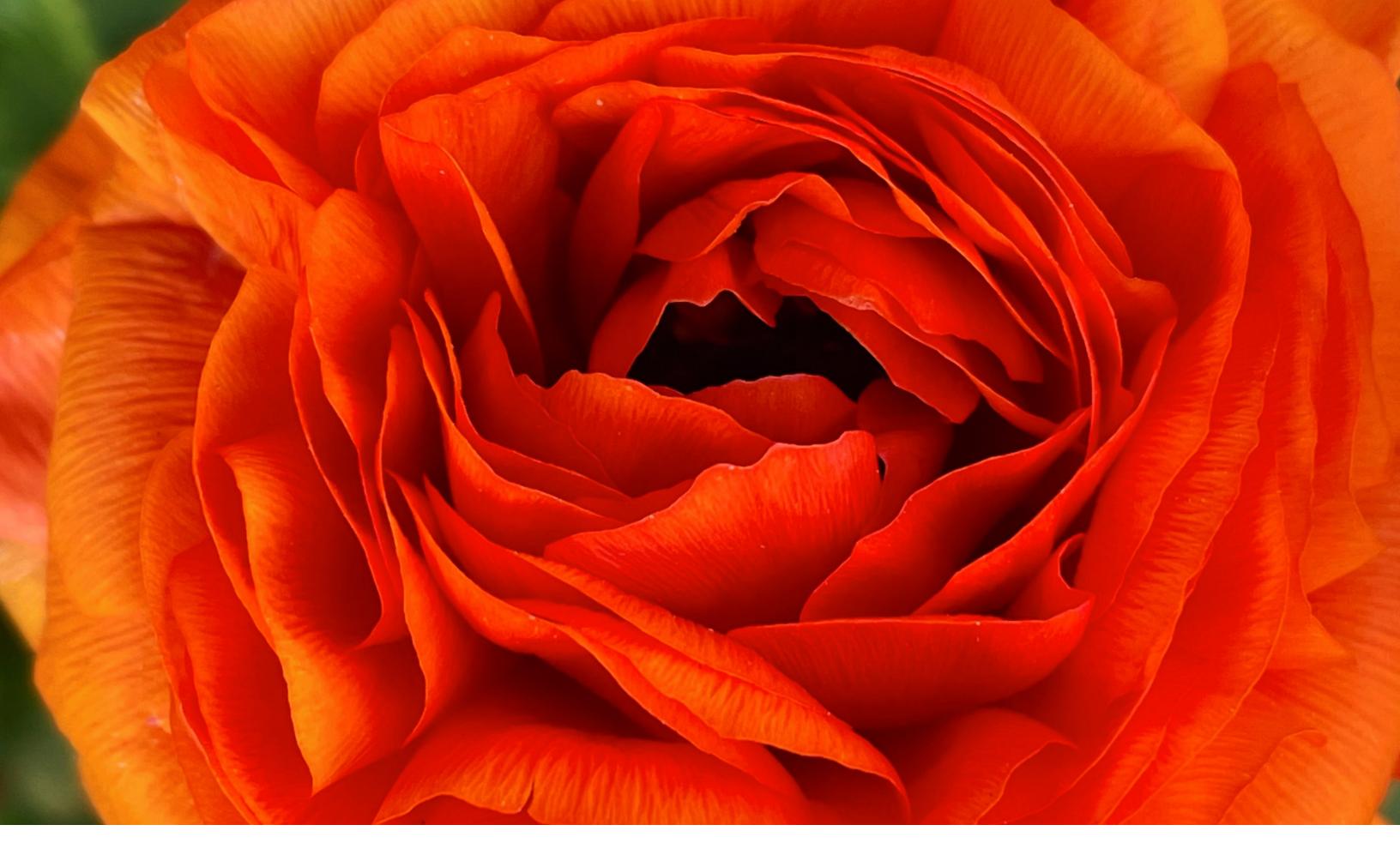


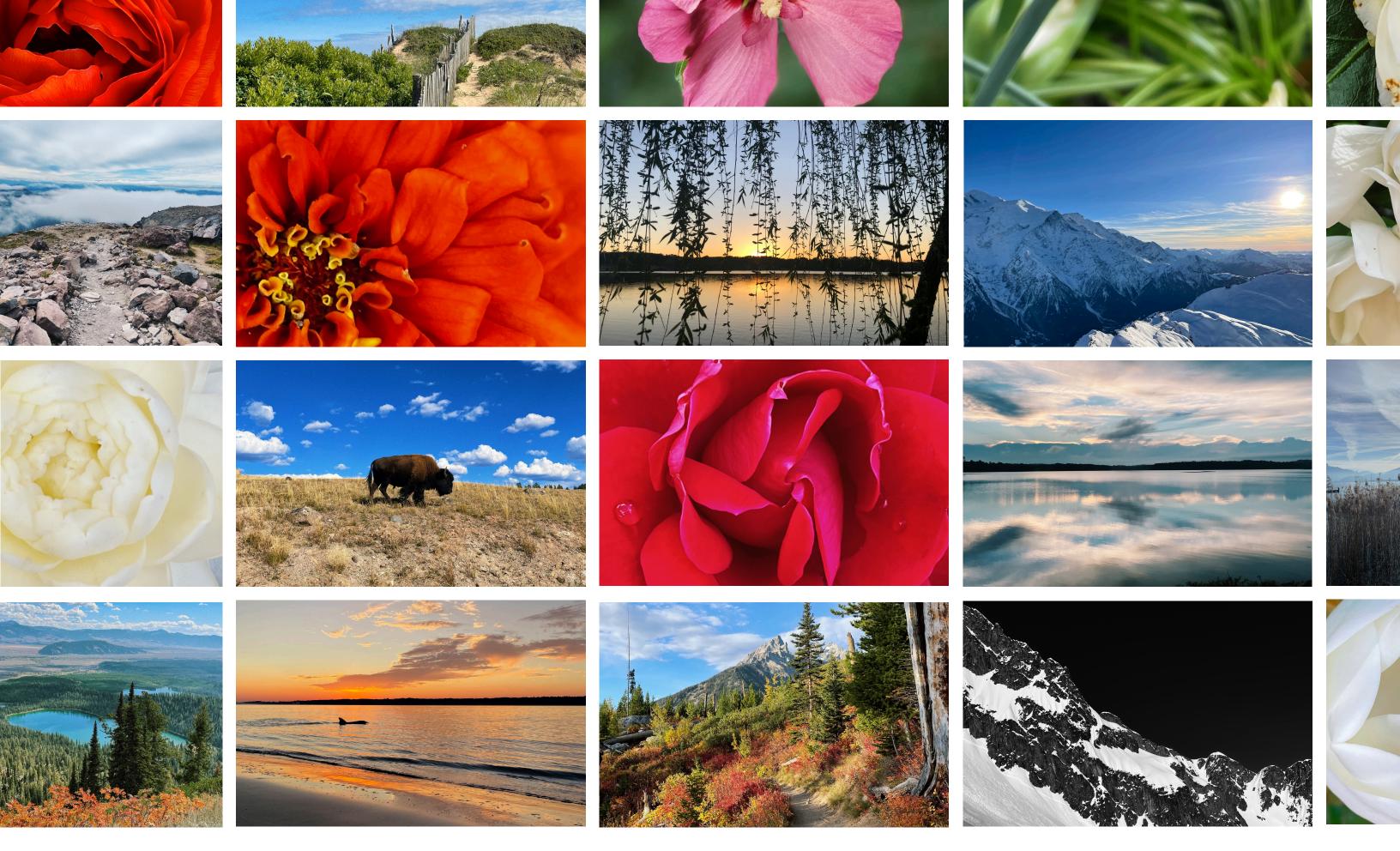
